Why have I received this letter?

What happens next?

How will my privacy be protected?

In compliance with privacy laws, we have only provided information about you to Wallis Social Research that is required for them to conduct the survey on our behalf. The survey is confidential, both Wallis and WorkSafe are operating under the Australian Privacy Principles, and nothing you tell us will affect your claim or your payments.

Your involvement in this survey is confidential. WorkSafe will use your survey answers to monitor and improve the performance of the CIP, but no identifiable information will be disclosed to any third party unless authorised by you, or in specific circumstances where it may be required by law.
